- 1) Students are selected by the program faculty
 - 2) Verification of learning disability from a Learning Disability Specialist or other qualified professional
 - 3) Two letters of recommendation from instructors, counselors, and/or employer
 - 4) One-page typed self-profile briefly describing background, educational impacts studies, and strategies to cope with the learning disability
 - 5) Up-to-date unofficial college transcript
 - 6) If candidates are unable to meet any of the above requirements, please submit a letter of explanation.
- Semester Awarded:** April 15th
- Criteria For Applying:** Successfully completed no fewer than 12 and no more than 72 degree-applicable units at LACC; at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA in all units completed at LACC, and currently enrolled in a minimum of 9 units at LACC

The Jay Allen Green Story

Jay Allen Green, a learning-disabled youth, was the teenage son of William and Effie Green. He was killed in a tragic accident. William Green, an employee of the Los Angeles Community College District, set up this scholarship in memory of his son, Jay. Mr. and Mrs. Green wanted not only to honor their son but also to assist LACC students who struggle with learning disabilities to succeed in college.
