II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

R. SCHWARTZ

- a. Robert Schwartz briefly reported on the following items
 - i. ALUMNI & FOUNDATION OUTREACH
 - 1. Carole Wenger submitted her expected year-end gifts report
 - a) Robert mentioned that Carole is continuing her communication with Mark Terasaki. Carole reported that \$100,000 might come from Mark Terasaki and his sister in honor of their mother Hisako Terasaki. Carole mentioned that they could name the Da Vinci Gallery for their mother
 - b) John Branca to give \$175,000 for a Virtual Learning Lab and promise of \$1M in two years from Michael Jackson estate
 - 2. Martha Pelayo submitted her report and Robert briefly discussed it with the Committee members
 - a) Amy Hanf, collaborated on a grant with YPI, Bixel Exchange, LA Trade Tech (Larry Frank), and President Gallagher. YPI will take the lead on a 3-year \$3 million grant to develop integrated systems (education/training, employers, supportive services) and enhance support to effectively prepare opportunity youth and struggling young adults for upwardly mobile career pathways in tech. LACC would receive \$125,000 every year over three years to develop entrepreneur training in the tech sector
 - b) Martha mentioned that Kaiser Permanente Foundation has funded our proposal which will enhance the role of the outreach representative to assist students facing barriers to success/program completion, and to promote the ADRN to BSN program to each student.

ii. 2019 GALA UPDATE

- 1. The gala planning continues and it's looking good. Robert mentioned that there is a big possibility that Jay Leno MC the Gala. Joan Dangerfield to ask him this week
- 2. Robert also mentioned that they are looking for live auction items (American Idol tickets, Dancing with the Stars, etc.)
